Title IX of the Educational Amendments of 1972 20 U.S.C ss1681

"No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any educational program or activity receiving federal financial assistance."

What Does Title IX Cover?

Unlawful Discriminatory Violations Under
Title IX:

Sexual Harassment: Unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature

Sexual Misconduct: Rape, sexual assault, sexual battery, sexual exploitation, and other forms of nonconsensual sexual activity

Stalking: Repeatedly following, harassing, threatening or intimidating, including by telephone, mail, electronic communications, or social media

Dating Violence: Physical abuse and/or emotional and verbal abuse with or without the presence of physical abuse

Domestic Violence: Physical abuse and/or emotional and verbal abuse with or without the presence of physical abuse

Retaliation: Adverse employment, academic, or other actions against anyone reporting or participating in an investigation of Title IX allegations
